

Martin and Natia are ready to teach us new steps.





“Donuts... a Lutheran Tradition”

I am writing this article at the suggestion of lovely Fern Basden. A few weeks ago, Fern emailed Lisa Hammel and me and suggested we write an article about the donuts that are provided at church during fellowship time. She wanted us to talk about how “magically the donuts” show up at the church, how dependable the donut providers are (*most of the time.... You guys know who we are talking about*) and MOST of all to thank the donut providers for what they do. OK Fern, here goes...

When I first started attending St. Matthew I have to admit I was a bit shocked at the donuts during fellowship time as well as only having caffeinated coffee. Although, I definitely have eaten a donut or two in life (BTW, my personal preference is apple fritters) I thought perhaps with the huge push for health living that perhaps church congregations “had moved on to healthier choices”. But they had not! While I was a bit shocked, Rob was in hog heaven (or should I say donut heaven).

We joined the church at the same time as the Hammels and were in the same new member class along with the Garretts and the McMillens. Lisa and I early on tried to change the tradition by bringing home made muffins but those went over like a lead balloon. People asked “Where are the donuts? Who forgot to bring the donuts?” *Editor’s Note: While doing some investigation for this article, Marian Meyer told me that Melanie Feusse did occasionally make homemade pound bread and it was well received. Lisa, let’s discuss soon!* I am proud to state that despite the muffin failure, Lisa and I were successful to adding decaffeinated coffee and tea as choices for a beverage. Yes!!!

Ok, back to Fern’s request. *How do those donuts appear?* There was an organization in the church called the “Couples Club” which changed its name about sevenish years ago to “The Fellowship Club” to be more inclusive of people that might not be a couple. I talked to several long time members and I was told that the Couples Club started the tradition of brining donuts on Sundays. (*If anyone knows anything different, please let me know.*) Members of the Couples Club volunteered to bring donuts to church every Sunday. A formal schedule was created and published. The member purchases donuts with their own monies and bring to the church for people to eat and enjoy while having fellowship with others. The donuts must be there by 9 AM. Another obligation of the person that brings the donuts is that they also must clean the coffee pots. This must occur before the late service. I am fortunate that my husband helps me with this. No, comment Mark McMillen. With the rebranding of the Couples Club to the Fellowship Club, now anyone in the church can sign up to bring donuts. Fern wanted to make sure that I thank everyone for this act of service. Your generosity and keeping up this wonderful tradition is very much appreciated by those that attend St Matthew.



Now more about the brands of donuts. There is a bit of competition as to who brings the “best donuts”. When Krispy Kreme was in Houston, we would always bring Krispy Kreme – those were our favorites! Rob now brings donuts from a small shop called Christies in Montrose which he says are the best donuts in town. Most members bring donuts from Shipley’s due the close location to the church.

We occasionally have had an issue of people not putting in their donation for their donut and coffee. The current recommended donation is \$1 for a cup of coffee and a donut. We had “gentle” reminders in previous Herald editions. This is not to scold people that cannot afford the donation – but if you have the means please throw a dollar in the donation basket. Marla Niksch shared with me that when Bill was the congregation President; her sons thought they could eat donuts for free since their dad was the Church President. Not!!! Another bit of information that many may not know. The donations for the coffee and donuts go to the Fellowship Club. These monies are used for special projects for the church and events of the Fellowship Club. Doug Hammel will attest that this is a very good revenue stream for the church.

Like any good writer, I did some Internet searches to see if there was any history regarding Lutherans donuts. I didn’t find anything specifically but here are a few excerpts from Garrison Keillor’s article “Singing with the Lutherans” that I thought might be interesting.

I have made fun of Lutherans for years – who wouldn’t, if you lived in Minnesota? But I have also sung with Lutherans and that is one of the main joys of life, along with hot baths and fresh sweet corn.

We make fun of Lutherans for their blandness, their excessive calm, their fear of giving offense, their lack of speed and also for their secret fondness for macaroni and cheese (Editor’s comment....disappointed he didn’t say donuts).

Lutherans drink coffee as if it were the Third Sacrament.

Lutherans are willing to pay up to one dollar for a meal at church.

And finally, you know you’re a Lutheran when:

- It’s 100 degrees, with 90% humidity, and you still have coffee after the service;
- **Donuts are a line item in the church budget, just like coffee; My favorite!!**
- The communion cabinet is open to all, but the coffee cabinet is locked up tight;
- And lastly, it takes 15 minutes to say, ‘Good-bye.’ So next service go a few minutes early, head to the Fellowship Hall, grab a cup of coffee (decaffeinated preferably) and a donut, sit down with someone you don’t know very well and strike up a conversation! That is the magic behind the donuts - to promote Christian fellowship.
